INCOME TAX PREPARATION

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

Property Tax Exemptions: Natick offers tax exemptions for seniors, veterans, legally blind and other qualifying taxpayers. Requirements vary for each exemption. Assessor's Office (508) 647-6420

TRANSPORTATION

Natick Connector: COA shuttle bus offering local door to door transportation with Natick area for seniors and residents with disabilities Offering rides 5 days/week 508-647-6540
