

LEASE RECERTIFICATION

Please be sure to hand in all your paperwork. Cedar Gardens is past due if you haven't sent it in already.

GARBAGE is picked up at all Cedar Garden units on Wednesdays between 8:00am-1:00pm. Please be sure your trash is outside in the trash barrels by 8:00am for pick-up.

DO NOT PARK CARS ALONG THE ROAD ON CEDAR TERRACE

This is an emergency parking only zone and not for resident parking. MWRTA buses, emergency vehicles and residents have trouble getting around parked cars. Parking for longer than 30 minutes to unload groceries, etc is a violation and subject to being towed.

LAUNDRY ROOM ETIQUETTE

Do:

- Be timely in removing clothes from washers and dryers.
- Give others 15-20 minutes of leeway after their cycle has finished before removing their clothes from the machine.
- Place other people's finished clothes either in a laundry basket or on top of the machine after giving appropriate leeway.
- Keep the laundry room neat and tidy.
- Clean up all spills and messes.
- Empty the lint tray when done using the dryer.
- Return all clothing left behind to its owner.
- Be respectful of others people's clothing.

Don't:

- Leave clothes in the washer or dryer after the cycle has finished.
- Throw other people's clothing onto the floor when removing it from machine.
- Be greedy with machines. Always share machines and leave at least one machine free for others to use.
- Overload machines with clothing or use too much detergent.
- Leave clothing or laundry baskets in the middle of the floor in the way of others.
- Make someone else clean up after you.
- Leave behind any clothing in the machines.

SCAM ALERT

Watch out! Scammers target everyone.





Recognize scammers. They may:

- PRETEND to be from an agency or organization you know.
- Say there's a PROBLEM or promise a prize.
- PRESSURE you to act immediately.
- · Tell you to PAY in a specific way.



Do not give scammers money or personal information - Ignore them!

How to avoid a scam:

- Remain calm. Talk to someone you trust.
- Hang up or ignore the message. DO NOT click on links or attachments.
- Protect your money. Criminals will insist that you pay in a hard-to-trace manner, such as with a gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash.
- Protect your personal information. Be skeptical of a contact you didn't initiate.
- Spread the word. Share your knowledge of Social Security-related scams. Post on social media using the hashtag (SlamtheScam to share your experience and warn others. Visit ssa.gov/scam for more information. Please also share with your friends and family.
